GREEN MEETINGS



Making sound environmental choices is not only the responsible thing to do, it's the right thing to do. Since opening in 1989 we have been an industry leader in the green movement and are continuously looking for ways to minimize the impact of large events on the environment. In 2011, we achieved LEED Silver Certification for these efforts - demonstrating that you don't have to be a new building to be certified, just committed to making the earth a better place for future generations. We invite clients and attendees to join us by minimizing the use of materials and natural resources that adversely impact the environment.

Waste Minimization

- · Recycling diverts approximately 40% of our total waste.
- · Initial recycling efforts began in 1990 with the diversion of glass and plastic bottles, aluminum cans, mixed paper, wood pallets and clean green waste.
- Mixed recyclables (paper, plastic, aluminum and glass) are collected daily in clearly marked bins throughout our building on a "no-fee" basis.
- · Used batteries, printer ink cartridges, light bulbs, tires and corrugated cardboard are diverted.
- · Copper wire is recycled after every show, averaging five tons annually.
- Cooking oil is collected and recycled into bio-diesel fuel.

Energy Efficiency

- · Heating/Cooling System replacement and upgrades save 2.7 million kWh annually.
- · Energy-management software and energy-efficient lighting saves 734,000 kWh annually.
- · Energy-efficient dishwashers in our kitchen save 3,297 kWh and 8,198 gallons of water annually.
- · Installation of fluorescent lighting in our exhibit halls saves 1.3 million kWh annually and reduces energy consumption by approximately 44%. Our exhibit halls are the first in the nation to go 100% fluorescent.
- · Our in-house green team is dedicated to exploring and implementing the best green practices by encouraging

Water Conservation

- Low flow automatic sinks and toilets are in all restrooms.
- Outdoor landscaping uses drip irrigation, drought-tolerant plants and mulch to reduce watering.
- Combined conservation efforts save 81,026 gallons of water annually.

Food Composting

 Nearly 150 tons of food waste is diverted annually and our goal is to divert all food scraps and eliminate the use of garbage disposals.

Environmental Purchasing

- Products made with biodegradable and recycled materials including copy paper, legal pads, envelopes, toilet paper, facial tissue and paper towels are purchased.
- Environmentally responsible cleaning products are purchased for carpets, floors, kitchens and bathrooms.
- Dry cleaning and laundering services for staff uniforms use biodegradable solvents.
- Fruits, vegetables, olive oils and seafood are purchased from local farms and suppliers that are within a 100 mile radius, as supply and season allows.
- Green disposable cutlery and plate ware are available on request. There are compostable, sustainable and recyclable options. Please inquire as to the best option for your event.

 All in-house contractors require adherence to green practices.

Donating Reusable Goods

- Coordination with clients ensures excess food is donated to local charities following events. Approximately 100 tons of food is donated to local charities annually.
- Leftover convention items, unclaimed lost and found items and surplus furniture and computers are donated to local schools and social service organizations. Over 10 tons are donated annually.

Leadership

 Executive management develops best practices to minimize the impact of events globally by participating on IAVM's Sustainability Committee for environmentally responsible public assembly facility management.

Transportation

- San Diego is among the "Top 25 Most Walkable U.S. Cities" based on an annual survey by the American Podiatric Medical Association.
- Downtown is home to hotels, restaurants, retail shops and attractions within walking distance of the Convention Center.
- Our Convention Center is easily accessible via the San Diego Trolley or bus.
- Close proximity of hotels to the Convention Center reduces shuttling and emissions.
- Employees receive paid incentive to use public transit.
