

Dear Colleague,

Today we begin a research project—the Census of Religion and Theology Programs—that will have enormous import for our field. We need your participation!

The questionnaire, designed by leaders in the study of religion with assistance from the National Opinion Research Center (NORC) at the University of Chicago, seeks to capture critically needed data on the academic study of religion at the undergraduate level. By the "academic study of religion," we mean all disciplined reflection in the areas of religious studies, theology, Bible and sacred texts—from both within and outside of communities of belief and practice.

The Census includes questions about the curriculum, faculty, and students of departments and programs in religion at fully accredited colleges and universities in the United States and Canada. This information is available only from you and your colleagues.

The questionnaire asks specifically about undergraduate programs. A future research effort will address graduate programs. Taken together, these two Census elements will provide a never-before-available data resource for all those interested in the future development of our field.

With the support of the Lilly Endowment and the endorsement of major societies in the study of religion, we can address effectively the need for accurate, reliable and useful information. We intend to collect data from every identified academic unit in which the study of religion is a central focus. Moreover, we will provide these data to you and your colleagues for your use in strategic decisions.

Please take time to complete the Census of Religion and Theology Programs and return it to NORC in the enclosed envelope as soon as possible. By participating, you will help your department as well as the field. **NORC will prepare for all respondents a customized report comparing your department or program with national data**. Your responses are strictly confidential. No data identifying individual institutions, departments or programs will be released.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation. With it, the Census will open yet another new chapter in the study of religion across North America. Your participation will ensure our success.

## **Instructions for Completing Census Questionnaire**

- 1. Please review the label on the back cover of this questionnaire. Use the "Information Supplied By" box to correct any information on the label.
- 2. In this questionnaire, all questions asking about your "department or program" refer to the study of religion within the academic unit printed on the first line of the label. When we ask about "the study of religion," we mean the term in an inclusive sense (e.g. religious studies, theology, Bible and sacred texts).
- 3. Please answer each question in sequence by marking the appropriate box and/or by printing the requested information in the space provided. The questionnaire will ask you for data on courses offered, student enrollments, and faculty. To help you provide the most accurate data possible, you may need to consult records such as course schedules and catalogs, student enrollment rosters and department budgets.
- 4. The reference period for the Census is the 1999-2000 academic year, by which we mean the academic year that spanned the summer term of 1999 through the spring term of 2000. Several questions ask for comparison data from the 1996-1997 academic year, by which we mean the academic year that spanned the summer term of 1996 through the spring term of 1997. If a question does not give a specific time reference, the assumed time reference is the 1999-2000 academic year.
- **5.** Please mail the completed questionnaire to NORC within 14 days in the pre-addressed, pre-paid envelope provided. You may wish to retain a photocopy of your completed questionnaire. While your participation is voluntary, it is essential to the survey's success.


