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AAR 2014 EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING AWARD RECIPIENT



The AAR's Teaching and Learning Committee is pleased to announce <u>Shafique N. Virani</u> is the recipient of the 2014 Excellence in Teaching Award.

Virani is Distinguished Professor of Islamic Studies and chair of the Department of Historical Studies at the University of Toronto. He was previously on faculty at

Harvard University (from where he also received his Ph.D.) and Zayed University in the United Arab Emirates. He is the author of *The Ismailis in the Middle Ages: A History of Survival, A Search for Salvation* (Oxford University Press, 2007), along with numerous articles and translations and a co-written play in which he also performed. He has taught and volunteered in a variety of global contexts, from universities to impoverished areas in the developing world. His pedagogical innovations include the incorporation of multimedia in the classroom and being the first professor to use the i-Clicker response system to teach religion. He has received several teaching awards and is known as a mentor who provides opportunities for both undergraduate and graduate students to join him in cutting-edge research projects.
