NEW MENTORING PROGRAM

AAR announces a one-year pilot mentoring program to commence November 2013 at the Annual Meeting in Baltimore. This program is an initiative of three standing committees of the AAR: Status of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Intersex, & Queer Persons in the Profession (LGBTIQ); Status of Women in the Profession (SWP); and Status of Racial and Ethnic Minorities in the Profession (REM). The program grew out of successful mentoring lunches during the annual meetings, informal mentoring opportunities, and an expressed need by the members of these underrepresented groups. Thirty doctoral students, non-tenured (i.e., pre-tenure, adjunct, contract, or hybrid administrator/faculty) faculty, and/or post-doctoral fellows will be matched with participating scholars who will serve as mentors for a period of one year. Depending on mentee needs and mentor capacities, mentors will offer guidance with some of the following: professional development/discernment, access to networks, strategizing about publication(s), job-seeking (including jobs outside the academy or outside the tenure track), the tenure and promotion process, and work/life balance.
