### REMEMBER TO PACK

- YOUR NAME BADGE! If you registered by September 17, you should receive your name badge in the mail. Once you arrive in Atlanta, pick up a name badge holder and then feel free to attend any Annual Meeting event; you do not need to come by registration. Those who registered September 17 and after will have to pick their badge up onsite. If you registered by September 17 and did not receive your badge in the mail, you can pick one up onsite. While the first badge reprint will be complimentary, all additional reprints will be \$5 each. Make sure to wear your badge at all Annual Meetings events—it helps people identify you, and there are some sessions with extra security where badges will be checked.
