In Memoriam

Edward Ian Bailey, Centre for the Study of Implicit Religion and Contemporary Spirituality



Edward Bailey, a longtime AAR member, passed away April 22, 2015, at his home in Oxford, England. Born in 1935, Bailey, a graduate of Cambridge, the United Theological College in Bangalore, and Bristol University, was also a Church of England parish priest. His academic work focused on the idea of implicit religion or,

in his words, "that 'everybody has a religion of some sort,' a faith by which they live, albeit as an uncoscious core at the center of their way of life or being." His work on implicit led to the creation of the Centre for the Study of Implicit Religion and Contemporary Spirituality. Obituaries for Dr. Bailey can be read here and here.
