









AAR RELEASES STATEMENTS ON ANTI-MUSLIM RHETORIC AND CAMPUS CARRY LAWS

In November, AAR's Board of Directors issued a <u>statement</u> rejecting anti-Muslim rhetoric. The statement calls upon AAR members to reject divisive and dangerous speech and to reaffirm our shared commitment to a free and open society where all residents' rights are recognized and protected. AAR joined a number of our sibling societies in the American Council of Learned Societies to address campus carry in light of the new concealed weapon law in Texas. AAR released <u>its own statement</u> on how the concealed weapon law will compromise campus security, in addition to signing the <u>Joint Statement</u> with the ACLS.



Religion and the Arts Award Nominations




AAR Seeks Book Awards Submissions
