








BRYAN HEHIR NAMED 2016 MARTY AWARD WINNER



The <u>Committee on the Public Understanding of Religion</u> is pleased to announce J. Bryan Hehir is the recipient of the 2016 Martin E. Marty Award for the Public Understanding of Religion. Hehir is the Parker Gilbert Montgomery Professor of the Practice of Religion and Public Life at Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government. His teaching and research focus on ethics and foreign policy and the role of religion in

world politics and in American society. Hehir holds a doctor of theology degree from Harvard Divinity School. SHAHZIA SIKANDER: 2016 RELIGION AND THE ARTS AWARD WINNER

The Religion and the Arts Award Jury is delighted to announce that <u>Shahzia Sikander</u> has been selected as the recipient of the 2016 award. Sikander's artwork, which is rooted in the Muslim and Hindu traditions of Indian and Persian miniature painting, is internationally renowned. From tiny layered drawings that insert the personal into traditional ritual forms, to video projections that re-interpret the miniature for the digital age, Sikander's



work ranges across media, including drawing, painting, large-scale installations, and performance. She will be the featured speaker in a Special Topics Forum this year at the Annual Meeting in San Antonio.
