Keshavarz Delivers 2016 ALHR Series

The <u>American Lectures in the History of Religions</u> (ALHR) welcomes <u>Dr. Fatemeh Keshavarz</u>, University of Maryland, to speak in Notre Dame, Indiana, and Chicago from October 24–28, 2016. Dr. Keshavarz's lecture series is entitled <u>Unsilencing the Sacred: Conversations with the Divine</u>.



The lectures explore the works of poets such as Omar Khayyam, Hafez of Shiraz, Sa'di, Jalal al-Din Rumi, and 'Attar of Nishabur. All lectures are open to the public.

The remaining lectures include "Do the Stars in Heaven Speak?" Rumi, a Poet for the 21st Century (Thursday, October 27, at Elmhurst College) and Hubbub in the Wine House: The Mutinous Voice in 'Attar and 'Eraqi (Friday, October 28, at the University of Chicago). 

In Memoriam

Jacob Neusner (1932–2016), Bard College, Emeritus



Distinguished Service Professor Emeritus of the History and Theology of Judaism and Senior Fellow, Institute of Advanced Theology at Bard College, Jacob Neusner died Saturday, October 8, 2016, at the age of 84. Longtime member and President of the AAR in 1969, Professor Neusner earned the PhD from Columbia University and his rabbinical degree from the Jewish

Theological Seminary. He began teaching at Bard College in 1994 and also taught at Dartmouth College, Brown University, and the University of South Florida.
