The travel grant will offset the travel costs associated with attending the Annual Meeting: registration fees (including tours and workshops), hotel room, transportation, and meals **up to \$1,500**.

### MENTORING FOR UNDERREPRESENTED PERSONS IN THE PROFESSION

The American Academy of Religion announces the continuation of a program to assist in the mentoring of underrepresented groups. The program is an initiative of the four standing committees of the AAR:



- Status of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Intersex, & Queer Persons in the <u>Profession (LGBTIQ)</u>
- Status of People with Disabilities in the Profession (PWD)

- Status of Racial and Ethnic Minorities in the Profession (REM)
- Status of Women in the Profession (SWP)

Thirty-five applicants will be matched with participating scholars who will serve as mentors for a period of one year.

### Call for Applications for AAR-Luce Fellowships in Religion and International Affairs



The AAR invites applications for AAR-Luce Fellowships in Religion and International Affairs. The program places scholars with PhDs or ThDs, grounded in the humanities or related social sciences, at the US Department of State, under the Department's Franklin Fellows Program. Fellows will participate in substantive work of the Department involving

religion and international affairs. Fellows will receive a stipend of up to \$6,500 per month plus up to \$1,500 as a relocation subsidy.

Funded by a grant from the Henry Luce Foundation, the Fellowship program seeks to bring scholarly knowledge and critical perspectives to the analysis of contemporary issues and the shaping of policy; and to offer scholars opportunities to contribute their expertise while learning about the functioning of a US government agency.
