

In Memoriam



Huston Smith (1919–2016), Syracuse University, Emeritus

Huston Cummings Smith, Thomas J. Watson Professor of Religion and Distinguished Adjunct Professor of

Philosophy, Emeritus, Syracuse University, passed away on December 30, 2016, at the age of 97. Professor Smith introduced millions to the study of world religions through his research, television series, film documentaries, recordings, interviews, and publications, including his bestselling work *The World's Religions*. A longtime member of the AAR, he was awarded the Martin E. Marty Public Understanding of Religion Award in 2004.
